Your call. Pacifica is presumably looking for your permission to use this document to help it secure a role on project. I'm worried about Pacifica involvement in this, given their skepticism could undermine our progress. For example, Greg told us that they did not think that the Olympia initiative they wrote would survive the courts, so their use of that document doesn't seem likely to help our cause.

Safer would be the city working with us (smith and Lowney) since we're proponents. On Lisa's request, I sent her a letter talking about how we could help, and she has circulated to Ben noble and central staff asking that they consider. Maybe it's worth waiting on responding to Greg for a few days while Lisa works on that. Obviously it's more likely that the city ultimately goes with a larger firm, but I don't think it benefits the project to help Pacifica get a role given their position on legal viability.
